Tim Conlon

Head of Enterprise Engagement, Higher Education Authority Ireland

Tim Conlon looks after enterprise engagement at the Higher Education Authority (HEA), Ireland's statutory planning and policy development body for higher education and research. He graduated from the University of the Creative Arts (UK) and has an MBA from the Smurfit School of Business at UCD.

Currently based in the strategic policy and planning section, Tim has worked at the HEA for over ten years, holding various posts at the national research council, HEA research and infrastructure programmes and HEA policy and planning. He has worked on the design and assessment the Programme for Research in Third-Level Institutions (PRTLI), the Strategic Innovation Fund (SIF), the mid-term review of SIF and the development of a HEA policy on Open and Distance Learning. He has also participated in external reviews of architectural education provision, the review of the Irish Universities Quality Board (IUQB) and the review of the Royal College of Surgeons in Ireland in relation to the commencement of its degree-awarding powers and a review of Creative Arts Provision in the Dublin Region. Tim is currently working on strategic instruments designed to improve ICT Skills provision in the higher education sector as well as labour market activation measures. In his enterprise engagement role, Tim is investigating the nature of relationships between business, enterprise and academia and is preparing the HEA's policy for sustainable enterprise engagement. Tim has served as the National Delegate for FP7 Theme 8: Social Sciences and Humanities. In his capacity as Acting Director of the Irish Research Council for the Humanities and Social Sciences (IRCHSS) he sat on the management boards for ERA-Net projects in the social sciences (NORFACE) and in the humanities (HERA). Since participating on the Japan Exchange and Teaching Programme in 1997, Tim has maintained an interest in the language and culture of Japan. More recently Tim has served as policy adviser to the Minister for Foreign Affairs.
