AWARDS FOR BEST PROJECTS

CMEPIUS has taken care of the projects' quality since the beginning. That is why, we have joined the European Community initiatives and we give out European and national awards for exceptional achievements every year. The quality awards are the recognition of work done by project promoters and other participants, and are the acknowledgment of creativity, innovation and also motivation for further international projects. Simultaneously, they give meaning to CMEPIUS's work as the national agency, which manages the projects and supports individuals and institutions.

The European Language Label is the

European Community initiative in the field of language learning and teaching, which contributes to the awareness of the importance of the linguistic diversity in Europe. The aim of the initiative is to encourage good practices and innovation in language learning and teaching, distribution of successful project results, and to stimulate public interest in improving language skills.

The awarded projects focus on different language areas, they have a wide range of target groups, from the youngest to the oldest, thus, encouraging the learning and the teaching of languages which are rare. They may be carried out at the national level within regional integration; however, the projects, which represent good practice at the European level and which have originated within the European Community programmes, are the most

European Language Label

The best projects within the Lifelong Learning programme are projects with clear ideas, defined goals and efficient management. These projects result in positive changes, not only in the individuals who participate in them, but also in the organisations which implement them, in the environment, and in the field in which they operate. These projects live after their official termination; their results are used in practice, and their experiences initiate new concepts, projects and ideas. These projects within the Lifelong Learning programme are annually awarded the

Apples of Quality, which represent their excellence, innovation, courage, exceptionality and readiness for lifelong learning and constant improvement. The national quality awards are alternately granted to the best examples of mobility and multilateral projects and partnerships in the Lifelong Learning programme.

The Golden Cable is a national award for work and effort for the best projects of the eTwinning action in the Lifelong Learning programme, which is awarded at the annual conference KONFeT. The purpose of the award is to encourage the projects' quality, which result in the use of information technology in primary and

KONFeT > The primary emphasis when selecting the best projects is on school cooperation. This means that the entire school lives with these awarded projects, which involve different subjects and activities, as well as cooperation between teaching staff and pupils from different classes. The second emphasis is on innovation. These projects can display the most innovative use of information technology, the introduction of new teaching methods and creative selection of project themes.

The Golden Cable award is becoming more and more recognised. It contributes to the awareness of the necessity of information technology introduction in the learning process.

In addition to the quality and the efficient project implementation, CMEPIUS also concentrates on the projects' results, especially with regard to their further application and valorisation. We organise national valorisation and theme conferences which focus on themes, such as creativity and innovation in the Lifelong Learning programme, cooperation between business and education, preparation of individuals for their international mobility, poverty and marginalisation. The aim of such events is to highlight examples of good practise and their results, to expose possible weak points and to define challenges for the future. These events are an ideal opportunity for the exchange of experiences, opinions and results of various projects, which deal with certain common themes – CMEPIUS will continue to support such quality meetings.

OTHER CMEPIUS TASKS Bilateral and Multilateral Cooperation in the Field of Higher Education

CMEPIUS coordinates the regional mobility programme for students and professors named CEEPUS, which started in 1995. Nine countries participated initialy; and currently, the institutions from the following countries are involved in the programme: Slovenia, Austria, Bulgaria, Serbia, Macedonia, Montenegro, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Kosovo, Albania, Romania, Poland, the Czech Republic, Slovakia, Croatia and Hungary.

The CEEPUS programme supports scholarships for individuals within the approved network of major higher education institutions from different participating countries, which then exchange students and professors.

The exchange can also involve students, whose home institution and/or host institution are not part of the CEEPUS network, but they are a part of the so-called CEEPUS countries: these exchanges are known as Freemover




Bilateral agreements Through the Ministry of

Education, Science and Technology, the Republic of Slovenia supports the exchange of students and researchers with different countries on the basis of bilaterally expressed interests in the form of concluded international agreements. CMEPIUS is responsible for the technical implementation of calls for proposals – from the publication to the signing of contracts with the selected students.

In addition, CMEPIUS also includes on its website calls for proposals from foreign governments and institutions for Slovenian students. The students from the countries which have concluded the international agreement with Slovenia have precedence in all implemented exchanges.

CMEPIUS also provides information to Slovenians and incoming foreigners on actions required prior to their arrival and stay in the country of their destination.

ERASMUS MUNDUS II



CMEPIUS in Slovenia organises informative days and workshops for preparation to successful application to calls for proposals; it counsels and supports the Slovenian universities in their participation in the Erasmus Mundus programme.

EURAXESS 'Researchers in Motion'



The European initiative EURAXESS is the successor of the European network EraMore. In addition to local EURAXESS information points in Slovenia, the initiative also includes the website portal EURAXESS. The portal primarily offers Slovenian researchers the access to the base of research job vacancies. The base includes advertisements from more than 4,500 universities, institutions, development companies and centres from 35 countries. The mobility and researches are financed from various public and private sources. The European portal as well as the national portals encourage and simplify the international mobility of researchers with their updated and detailed information. In addition to practical information required prior to the mobility (visa, residence permit, accommodation, health and social insurance, pension insurance, language preparations, the moving of the family, etc.), the portal represents the basic means for the promotion of the European Charter for researchers and the Code of Conduct for the recruitment of researchers.

CMEPIUS in Slovenia functions as the so-called bridgehead organisation, which maintains the Slovenian portal EURAXESS (www.euraxess.si) and coordinates the network of EURAXESS Slovenia information points.

National group of Bologna experts

CMEPIUS in cooperation with the Ministry of Education, Science and Technology of the Republic of Slovenia coordinates the work of the National group of Bologna experts, which includes experts from high and higher education fields (vice rectors, deans, higher education professors, experts for high and higher education fields and students'

The Bologna expert group primarily offers to university staff and students at higher education institutions and high education professional schools, expert help and support in the area of the Bologna process: implementation of the three level study structure, European credit transfer and accumulation system, evaluation of study achievements (national qualification framework) and information on changes in the field of higher education. The European Commission within the project of the National group of Bologna experts organises seminars and workshops, which are attended by the Bologna experts from all European countries with the purpose of the exchange of experiences and the examples of good practise. The members of the Slovenian group meet at regular meetings (sessions) where, with the help of the competent ministries and organisations from the field of higher education, they try to find solutions to the problems in the area of implementation of the Bologna process on the national and higher educational level and to the current problems in the field of higher education. CMEPIUS and the Ministry of Higher Education hold the annual event – National panel discussion on higher education, discussing one of the current themes in the higher education in Slovenia. The work of the National group of Bologna experts can be observed at the CMEPIUS website.

TEMPUS IV (2007 – 2013)

Tempus is the European programme which enables and supports reforms and modernisation of higher education in countries and regions which border to the European Union. These are the countries of the Western Balkans, Eastern Europe, Central Asia, North Africa, Middle East and the Russian federation, Institutions and partnerships include European and neighbouring countries. Every year, with the Tempus programme calls for proposals, they have an opportunity to receive the means for the implementation of joint projects for the transfer of knowledge between the participating parties in the projects, as well as for the introduction of broadly designed reforms of higher education in the neighbouring countries.

The programme is coordinated by the Executive agency in Brussels, while CMEPIUS in Slovenia offers contact and information points.
