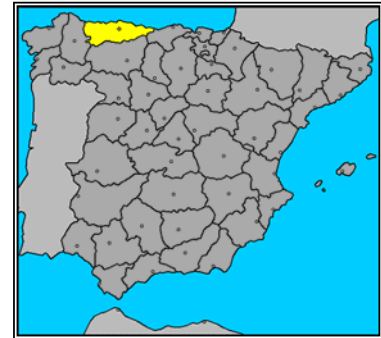

Asturias is a Spanish province and also an Autonomous Community officially called the Principality of Asturias. It is in the north of Spain, bathed by the Cantabrian Sea.



It is a natural mountainous and very green area, with dreamlike beaches. It is ideal for beach and nature tourism, in an environment of high ecological interest that is very well preserved.



It has a size of approximately ten thousand square metres, shared out into a surprising variety of landscapes. With the great proximity of the Cantabrian Mountains to the coast (approximately thirty kilometres), their profile smoothens out as the coastal area is approached, with small and beautiful valleys appearing.

- Since 2004, we are leading a group of companies with over 1500 workers, managing their continuous training as an authorised training centre.
- Offering personalised programmes for integral training of adult persons with disabilities.

<p>Training and Employment Workshops</p> <p>Training and Employment Workshops</p>	<p>These are public employment-training programmes aimed at job insertion for unemployed people with low skills' levels by means of their training, alternating same with work activities related to the recovery or promotion of the historical, cultural or natural heritage, the restoration of town or environmental settings, as well as of any other social utility.</p> <p>Such an approach makes it possible to train a series of professionals in traditional crafts and in new employment areas (bricklaying, painting, plumbing, masonry, metal carpentry, gardening, caring for dependent individuals, tourist resources, drawing up educational materials, recovering ethnographic elements etc.) that are in demand on the job market, while at the same time representing an excellent resource for self-employment.</p>
