Dear colleagues in Slovenia. Over the last months Reykjavík University has established many new contacts in Slovenia. After listening to their enquiries about collaboration opportunities through the Scholarship fund, RU decided to put forward a training program for staff and professors at Slovenian universities. The courses will last a week and will take place at Reykjavík University in Reykjavík during the first two weeks of June.

Hereby Reykjavík University presents a brief description of three courses for didactic and administrative staff in Universities. The course's chief purpose is to strengthen participants' professional competences and to broaden their horizon by exploring how RU approaches these issues. It also encourages critical discussion about proficient methods of work in universities.

All courses are 5 days long and consist of 20 hours teaching and 12 hours culture and excursion of Iceland's nature.

THE THREE COURSES ARE:

- 1. University Didactics
- 2. The Methodology of Writing Scientific Papers
- 3. The International University or The International Office From Good to Great

BRIEF DESCRIPTIONS OF COURSES:

1. TITLE OF COURSE: UNIVERSITY DIDACTICS

Course description: The course focuses on active and collaborative teaching methods in universities and introduces learning management systems.

Duration: 20 hours

Topics covered in the course are:

- 1. The Bologna Process and learning outcome in higher education.
- 2. Active and collaborative teaching methods to make the learning more effective for students.
- 3. Learning management in school environment in RU (MySchool, best practice).
- 4. Creating a syllabus and writing learning outcomes.
- 5. Using InformationTechnology in Teaching.

2. TITLE OF COURSE: THE METHODOLOGY OF WRITING SCIENTIFIC PAPERS

Course description: The course's aim is to answer the questions: 1) What does a technically sound grant application look like and what are the major pitfalls in writing a good proposal? 2) Best practice in project management applied to sponsored research projects 3) The financial accounting system applied to sponsored research projects.

Duration: 20 hours

Topics covered in the course are:

- 1. How to write a good grant proposal to a competitive fund.
- 2. How to write and publish a scientific paper.
- 3. Evaluation of research activity at RU Example: Reykjavík University Annual assessment of research activity and assessment of school.
- 4. Best practice in project management applied to sponsored research projects.
- 5. The financial accounting system applied to sponsored research projects.

3A. TITLE OF COURSE: THE INTERNATIONAL UNIVERSITY

Course description: Main characteristics of the International University and the road necessary to travel in order to get there.

Goal of the course: The goal of the course is to give participants an overview of how to internationalize a national university. Participants will become aware of the importance of policy and strategy and the role of the international affairs office as an agent of change.

Duration: 20 hours

- 5. The International Office

- 7. Your Academic Partners: What do they say about you?
- 8. Internships the future

- 7. Your partners a strategy or happening?
- 8. Orientation for incoming and outgoing students
- 9. Your homepage the neglected child of the house or your main marketing tool?
